CAROL GILLIGAN, PH.D.

HANS W. LOEWALD MEMORIAL AWARD

Carol Gilligan is a psychologist, writer, and activist, best known for *In a Different Voice*, "the little book that started a revolution." Named by *Time* magazine as one of the 25 most influential Americans for having "changed the voice of psychology," she held Harvard's first chair in Gender Studies and is currently a University Professor at NYU. Her most recent book is *Why Does Patriarchy Persist?* with Naomi Snider.

CLAUDE BARBRE, PH.D.

DISTINGUISHED PSYCHOANALYTIC EDUCATOR

Claude Barbre, Ph.D., L.P., is Distinguished Full Professor, The Chicago School of Professional Psychology. Dr. Barbre served for 12 years as Executive Director of The Harlem Family Institute, New York. A five-time recipient of the Gradiva Award, he is currently a Board Member and Training Supervisor at The Chicago Center for Psychoanalysis (CCP), and in private practice in Chicago.

Tim Dean, Ph.D., is the James M. Benson Professor in English at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. PHILLIS ISABELLA SHEPPARD, PH.D.

DISTINGUISHED PSYCHOANALYTIC EDUCATOR

Phillis Isabella Sheppard, Ph.D. is E. Rhodes and Leona B. Carpenter Professor of Religion, Psychology, and Culture at Vanderbilt University Divinity School and Graduate Department of Religion. She joined the faculty in 2014. Previously she served as Associate Professor Pastoral Psychology and Theology on the faculty of Boston University School of Theology and on the faculty at North Park Theology Seminary where she was the Associate Professor of Pastoral Theology.

She is a psychoanalyst and a practical theologian whose work centers on constructive work in womanist methodology and the intersection of religion, culture and psychology. She is the author of two books, *Tilling Sacred Ground: Interiority, Black Women, and Religious Experience published by Rowman and Littlefield/Lexington Books, 2022* and *Self, Culture and Others in Womanist Practical Theology* was published by Palgrave Macmillan 2011 and numerous articles.
